#### 16-014 HAYLE HARBOUR AUTHORITY LTD. - HARBOUR MASTER'S REPORT

The Harbour Master presented his report.

Additional notes & comments:

The fishermen and commercial users were <u>extremely</u> concerned about the navigability of the harbour. There is a reduction in depth of about 50cm in parts of the harbour since February. The future viability of Hayle as a support port for the Wave Hub was questioned by Helen Wilson-Prowse. She was also concerned for the future of the Marine Renwables Business Park which is unlikely to be successful without a usable port.

There was a lengthy discussion on the issue and many questions on the position of the harbour owners regarding starting dredging and other other clearance operations.

It was RESOLVED unanimously (the HM abstained due to conflict of interest) to write a strongly worded letter to the harbour owners, Cornwall Council, Trinity House, the MMO and George Eustice, Minister of State for Farming, Food and the Marine Environment, describing:

- the continued decline in the navigable depth affecting commercial operations and safety
- reduction in the tidal window for harbour operations
- future viability of the port
- harm to the viability of the Marine Renewables Business Park and harbour

#### **16-015 COASTAL COMMUNITY TEAM UPDATE**

Bob Mims reported on a CCT meeting attended by George Eustice. George agreed to assist with funding streams for sand removal in the harbour.

The CCT report was welcomed and felt to be a good basis for future funding.
